An estimated 1 billion birds die from window collisions each year in North America - with 99% of these strikes happening at residential and low-rise buildings. Calculations show an average of 10 birds per residential home die annually in the United States. These deaths are preventable if people take action at their own homes! Please join us for a crash course on bird-window collisions: **Stop the Strike! Creating Bird-Friendly Windows at Home**. Former board president **Susan Fisher** will break down why birds fly into windows, how big the problem really is, and most importantly, what simple steps homeowners can take to stop these deadly strikes.
